AMENDMENT OF STANDING ORDERS.

That the following be an additional Standing Order:—

47a. At any time during the proceedings of the Synod any member may without notice or debate ask "whether in the opinion of the President the question should now be put"? and upon such question being asked or of his own act without such question being asked the President may inform the Synod that in his opinion the subject has been adequately discussed.

If after such expression of opinion by the President a motion be made "That the question be now put" such question shall then be put without debate and if such motion be carried the President shall forthwith put the question to the vote.

Provided that, whenever it is decided that any question shall be put the mover of the matter pending shall be permitted to speak in reply for ten minutes before the question be put.
