
*The Diocesan Revenues Ordinance 1940 Amendment
Ordinance 1948*

No. 5, 1948.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Diocesan Revenues Ordinance 1940 and for other purposes.

WHEREAS by the Diocesan Revenues Ordinance, 1947, it was determined that the sum of £4000 therein mentioned should be held upon trust to apply the same and the income therefrom for the purposes referred to in Clause 2 of the Diocesan Revenues Ordinance, 1940.

AND WHEREAS by reason of circumstances subsequent to the creation of the said last mentioned trusts it has become inexpedient to carry out and observe the same in their entirety and expedient to vary the same in manner hereinafter appearing.

Now the Standing Committee of the Synod of the Diocese of Sydney in the name and place of the said Synod ordains and declares as follows:—

1. By reason of circumstances subsequent to the creation of the said trust in respect of the said sum of £4,000 and the income therefrom it has become inexpedient to carry out or observe the said trusts in their entirety and expedient to vary the same in manner hereinafter appearing and the said trusts are hereby varied accordingly.

2. Clause 2 of the said Ordinance is amended by inserting at the end thereof the following new paragraph:—

(g) To pay to the present Archbishop of Sydney the sum of Three hundred and sixty pounds as a contribution towards his travelling expenses to England for the purpose of attending the forthcoming Lambeth Conference.

3. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Diocesan Revenues Ordinance 1940 Amendment Ordinance 1948."
