

Ordination Training Fund

Conditions and Expectations for Bursaries

1. A student who is accepted for training as a Sydney candidate is entitled to a bursary.
2. A student's Sydney candidature must be confirmed at the end of every academic year by the Archbishop. The Archbishop has appointed his Ministry Chaplains to make appropriate recommendations for ordination candidates or Diocesan Lay Workers. Recommendations are developed in cooperation with the Principal of Moore Theological College.
3. A student who is accepted as a Sydney candidate is accepted without any guarantee of ordination or commissioning or a ministry position.
4. For administration purposes, bursaries are paid directly to Moore Theological College or Youthworks College for the benefit of each Sydney candidate studying at the college.
5.
 - i) It is expected that students who benefit from the Sydney Ordination Training Fund bursary will render service in the Diocese of Sydney after their ordination or commissioning for three years.
 - ii) Unless special arrangements are made, it is expected that students who voluntarily terminate their candidature for ministry in the Diocese of Sydney will refund the bursaries from which they have benefited.
